GUEST SPEAKERS

Since COVID-19 started to slow this year, UGA MSF was able to provide both virtual and in-person shadowing hours to its members. This included health care professionals who had obtained an MD, DO, PA-C, DNP, SLP, Ph.D., MPH, or DDS.

EDUCATIONAL PANELS/PRESENTATIONS

Due to the controversial and complex nature of healthcare, it is important for members to be aware and develop their own opinion on these issues before going into the field themselves. HEALTHCARE TRAININGS/WORKSHOPS

The purpose of these was to prepare the students for their future and increase time in these environments improving their readiness for professional programs

SOCIAL EVENTS

ST. MARY'S JOINT INTERNSHIP

UGA MSF was able to partner with St. Marv's to provide a joint internship program. This program allowed students to rotate through 20 different St. Mary's locations shadowing all different health care specialists in the field. Interns were required to submit weekly reports of experiences and were graded by healthcare professionals.

RESEARCH ASSISTANTSHIP PROGRAM

The research assistantship program provided help to students who were looking for research positions. The secretary was able to send endorsements to professors and provide the students with help finding open positions that spark their interests!

LOCAL VOLUNTEER EVENTS/DRIVES

A large part of UGA MSF is giving back to the local community through service projects. UGA MSF was able to partner with St. Mary's hospital, Innovative Healthcare Institute, Red Cross, UGA student service clubs, homeless shelters, local farms, food banks, elementary schools, and vaccine clinics, all for the underserved communities in Athens Clarke County.
